Background on Cobalt Community Research

- 501c3 not for profit research coalition
- Mission to provide research and education
- Developed to meet the research needs of schools, local governments and nonprofit organizations



Study Goals

- Determine awareness surrounding expiration date of current assessment and type of assessment
- Identify best arguments for and against the public safety assessment
- Determine support for future options regarding public safety assessment



Bottom Line

- 88% of respondents voted in the November 2014 election
- 72% were aware the current assessment expires in March 2016
- 77% knew the proposed assessment was a renewal and not a new tax
- Two best arguments for the assessment:
 - I want to continue fire services in the Township (79%)
 - I want to continue dedicated police protection in the Township (64%)



Bottom Line (continued)

- Two best arguments against the assessment:
 - I object giving the Township the authority to increase the assessment by 10% (47%)
 - Other (44%) see page 15
- Majority of respondents (69%) would like to see the assessment, in its current form, put up for a re-vote
 - 37% would like to see the 10% fluctuation removed from the assessment
 - 32% would like to see fire services and dedicated police put on separate assessments
- Detailed information by specific demographic groups is available to aid in policy review
 - Detail by: age, location in the Township and school district




Methodology

- Conducted in December 2014 and January 2015
- Citizens could pick up survey from Township Hall or complete survey online
- Response from self-selected 302 citizens, from approximately 6,000 residents above the age of 18; providing a conventional margin of error of +/- 4.6 percent in the raw data (90% confidence)



Respondent Profile





November 4th Election/Awareness








